## **Colder Weather Coming...**

With the end of the season, most people have the job of putting away their bird for the long winters sleep. This does not mean that you can't spend some quality time with your machine. Maintenance is something that everyone can get a head start on for the spring. **Engine Work**—When was the last time you had your engine decoked? Can you do it yourself, or



should you send it to an authorized repair station. During the winter, you won't miss it as much. Make sure that you store your engine properly to prevent internal rust from moving in while not in use. **Fuel System**—How do those



fuel lines look? Can you rebuild your fuel pump? Clean out your fuel tank? Carburetor? **Airframe**—Most of our machines are pretty simple in construction, but metal will still corrode. Start with a blank sheet of paper and start listing all parts that are showing signs of time. Look at the bolts, nuts and other hardware and mark anything that is questionable. Look to see if there are any fatigue cracks starting or if any bolt holes are elongated. **Covering**—Fabric does not last forever. Are there any punctures or tears? How old are the sails? Is the frame under the sails showing signs of corrosion? **Instruments**—Have you been dealing with a RPM gauge that reads a little off? Is one of your temperature gauges not working? Maybe you've been good enough for Santa to leave you something special this year. **Controls**—How stiff are your throttle and choke cables? Pick up or borrow a Cable Oiler and use a quality lube to make it move smoothly and last longer. How much play is in your stick, flaps and rudder? May need an adjustment or replacement, but you have to look to make the determination.
