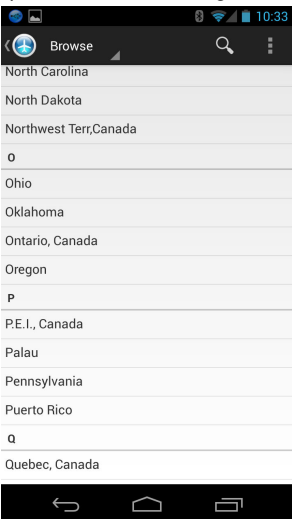

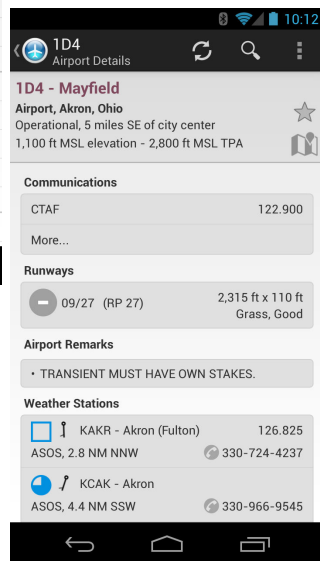
“FlightIntel for Pilots” on your Android Device

Information at your fingertips. FlightIntel for Pilots is an application like the Airport/Facility Data (A/FD) book that you use for Airport information such as Runways, Communication Frequencies, etc. Instead of having a library of books that contain about five states worth of information each, the program lists the states alphabetically and includes Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico and Canada.

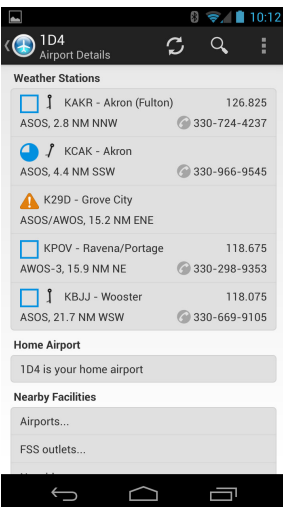
Simply select the state to start. You are then presented with a listing by City of the airports within. Select again, and you are presented with a listing of the data available for the airport you selected. At the Top Right section is a STAR icon which will toggle the airport as a favorite, and a MAP icon which will allow you to view the airport through Google Earth or Maps (for my device anyway).



I won't run through the entire list



of data points for the airport, but say that if you have found it in the airport directory on



your desk, you will most likely find it here.

Updates are processed every 56 days, and the download process goes pretty fast. As with retrieving any data through a data plan, make sure you know your rates and usage. I usually don't worry, because I have unlimited data, but still find it faster when I have a good WiFi connection.

Before selecting an airport, you also have the option of changing the Browse to Favorites or, Nearby. This will present filtered lists based on what you have marked as a Favorite, or where you are.

All in All, a nice way to have a full set of airport directories in the palm of your hand. Great as a reference to go to at breakfast to show off your dedication to being in the know, or planning that next cross country flight. Just make sure to have the most updated downloads.
