Refueling the Thirsty Beasts. (GP)

Gerald Jackson reports that Sonex #204 is flying and is indeed a fast and responsive aircraft. The Jabiru 80HP engine has been reported by those on the ramp as being very quiet and is also an efficient and smooth powerplant. He is evaluating #204 using the AC 90-89A document, which will help burn through the required 40 hour test period. Here's one tidbit for you: 120 MPH at 3500' MSL and 2800 RPM (3300 RPM is max). Stay tuned for more details.

One reason that the June meeting was a bit smaller than May, was because of an adventure to Michigan which took place on that same day (pix from that trip highlight this issue). Here is a report from the trip coordinator, Gil Pataky:

On June 3rd, 6 intrepid NCLF fliers departed Hinde airport in Huron bound for Frankenmuth airport. Paul Harvey, Gary Aman, and Mike Baker arrived at Hinde around 7:30 AM. Waiting for them were Mark Warner, Bob Schuck and Gil Pataky. The sky was questionable but the fliers were determined to make the trip. Warner in his Challenger, Harvey in his Pup, Aman in his Kolb, Pataky in his Hawk and Baker in his Savannah (with Schuck as co-pilot) departed for adventure.

The first leg was to Merillat airport approximately 78 miles away. With a slight headwind we managed to make the trip in about 1 1/2 hrs. We were looking forward to a stop and donuts! But alas, no donuts were available but coffee and a nice chat with Jim Merillat still made for a pleasant stop over. After refueling, all fliers departed for Owosso airport 71 miles away. The sky was clearing and the trip was very picturesque. The headwinds were starting to increase and Owosso was a welcomed sight. Owosso has three runways, two grass runways intersected by an asphalt runway. On approaching Owosso, there was guite a lot of radio traffic and once there I decided to change our intended runway. Planes were on the runways, planes in the sky and chatter on the radio. I decided to say, "what the heck" they either see us or they don't! :-), and landed without incident.

After refueling, we departed for Frankenmuth and Zehnder airport 30 miles away. We landed around 1 PM and took the shuttle into town, ate a lot of food, and drank a few beers.
